

## THE SAVIOR'S SUFFICIENT SACRIFICE

### Hebrews 10:5-17

Psalm 40:4-8

#### I-The Sacrificial System-

The Sacrificial System within the Old Testament Law could never make the worshipers righteous in their standing before God.

A-The system of sacrifices in the Old Testament was a shadow of what was to come.

B-In eternity past, the Godhead established the plan for Christmas.

The Son of God came into the world to mediate a new Covenant through the sacrifice of Himself.

John 3:16; Psalm 40:6-10

#### II-The Son's Sacrifice-

A- Hebrews 10:11 'And every priest stands daily at his service, offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins.'

Hebrews 10:5-7

Philippians 2:5-8

#### B-The comparison of the Levitical Sacrifices and Christ's sacrifice.

The Levitical sacrifices were <u>continual</u>	while	Christ's sacrifice was 1 time for all
The Levitical Priest sacrificed animals	while	Christ offered <u>Himself</u>
Levitical Sacrifices only <u>covered</u> sin	while	Christ's sacrifice removed it
Levitical sacrifices ceased	while	Christ's sacrifice is efficacious <u>forever</u>

Philippians 2:9-11

Today, Christ is seated at the right hand of God, indicating that He has completed His work.

#### III-The Spirit's Surety-

Heb. 10:15 states, 'The Holy Spirit also bears witness to us...'

A-The outward code described in the Old Testament law is now written in the heart of all who believe.

Jeremiah 23:5-6; 31:33-34

B-Our God will remember our sins and lawless deeds no more (Heb .10:17)

No, never, under any condition!

'Where there is forgiveness of these (sins), there is no longer any offering for sin.' V.18
